My family had moved to Sioux Falls so my dad could attend seminary, and I made several trips back and forth from Burke to Sioux Falls to visit. I was 24 years old when I got that first cell phone. And the first cell phone call I made was on Hwy 44, driving west, between Parker and the Freeman turn. It was an incredible feeling to make that phone call in the middle of nowhere, and to hear my mom's voice on the other end. It gave me such a sense of peace knowing that even though I was traveling alone, I could easily contact my family if something happened.

Fast forward 20 years to the smart phone. I've been deeply convicted recently by how much time I spend on my phone.

Are they handy? Absolutely. Do they keep us safer? Sure. But the fact that my phone is almost always within grabbing distance is a problem. My first cell phone did one thing. It made phone calls. But today, my smart phone allows me to call, text, watch movies, play video games, check social media, deposit money, pay bills, keep a schedule, take pictures, read maps, and more things than I can even list here.

I'm going to boil all this down to one thing; my phone keeps me away from true relationshipsmy relationship with God and my relationships with people. We *think* it makes life easier, but what it really does is isolates us and causes anxiety and depression in record numbers.


Friends, I don't have a perfect solution. But I can tell you that I am making a conscious effort to spend less time on my phone. Period. Anyone want to join me?
